EAST AYRSHIRE COUNCIL (B769 KINGSFORD, STEWARTON)(40MPH SPEED LIMIT)(AMENDMENT) ORDER 2016

- 4. The Order referred to within Column 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be amended to the extent specified in Column 2 of said Schedule.
