Where there is, immediately before the date on which the said road is stopped up under this Order, any apparatus belonging to any statutory undertakers, under, in, on, over along or across that length of road for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the said statutory undertakers shall after commencement of this order continue to have all rights in respect of the said apparatus as they had immediately before that date.
