### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, AS AMENDED**

#### **MORAY COUNCIL (SCHOOL STREETS, ELGIN – PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) ORDER 2022**

Moray Council in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Constable in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following order:-

#### **GENERAL**

1. This Order may be cited as “Moray Council (School Streets, Elgin – Prohibition of Driving) Order 2022 and will come into operation on (*date to be inserted*).
2. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

#### **PROHIBITION OF WAITING**

3. Save as provided for in Article 4 of this Order, no person, except upon the direction of or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform, shall cause or permit to be driven any motor vehicle on the lengths of road and at the times specified in the Schedules to this Order.

#### **EXEMPTION FROM WAITING RESTRICTIONS**

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting the following specified vehicles to be driven on the lengths of road specified in the Schedules to this Order;
  - a) a vehicle being used in connection with any building operation or demolition; the removal of any obstruction to traffic; the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of said lengths of road or part thereof; or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water, electricity or any kind of communications apparatus as defined in sub-paragraph 1 (1) of Schedule 2 of the Telecommunications Act 1984.
  - b) an individual, party or organisation authorised by the Council;
  - c) the police, fire brigade or ambulance service;
  - d) a vehicle displaying a disabled badge, being driven by or carrying a disabled person to uplift or set down passengers or wait at premises located on the prohibited road during the prohibited hours;

- e) where the vehicle is displaying a School Streets permit issued for the School Streets area in which the vehicle is being driven;
- f) a vehicle used as a contractual vehicle to uplift or set down a passenger or passengers;
- g) a vehicle used to allow a funeral undertaking;
- h) a vehicle used by healthcare workers to visit premises situated on the prohibited roads;
- i) a vehicle used to deliver goods to premises on the prohibited roads.

**SCHEDULE 1 – Seafield Primary School**

Location	Times (School Days only)
<b>Deanshaugh Terrace, Elgin</b> From point 7 metres or thereby east of the projected eastern kerbline of Munro Place for a distance of 195 metres or thereby in an easterly direction.	8.40 am to 9.10 am and 2.40 pm to 3.10 pm
<b>Anderson Crescent, Elgin</b> From its junction with the northern kerbline of Deanshaugh Terrace for a distance of 7 metres or thereby in a northerly direction.	8.40 am to 9.10 am and 2.40 pm to 3.10 pm

**SCHEDULE 2 – New Elgin Primary School**

Location	Times (School Days only)
<b>School Brae, Elgin</b> From a point 5 metres or thereby from its junction with the eastern kerbline of Main Street for its entire length, a distance of 180 metres or thereby.	8.30 am to 9.00 am and 2.30 pm to 3.00 pm
<b>Bezack Street, Elgin</b> From a point 2 metres or thereby from the projected northern kerbline of the northern junction of Anderson Drive to its junction with the projected southern kerbline of School Brae, a distance of 86 metres or thereby.	8.30 am to 9.00 am and 2.30 pm to 3.00 pm
<b>Pond Park Place, Elgin</b> From its junction with School Brae for its complete length	8.30 am to 9.00 am and 2.30 pm to 3.00 pm
