ORDER 2021

The Renfrewshire Council (Braille Crescent/ Braille Drive, Renfrew)
(Prohibition of Waiting, Loading & Unloading) Order 2021

The Renfrewshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 1(1), 2(1), 2(2) and 4(1) and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the Act”) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the “Chief Constable of Police Service of Scotland” in accordance of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order.

1. Citation and Commencement

This Order may be cited as “The Renfrewshire Council (Braille Crescent/ Braille Drive, Renfrew) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 2021 and shall come into operation on the Eighteenth day of November 2021.

2. Interpretation

In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:

“Council”	means the Renfrewshire Council;
“emergency service vehicle”	means a vehicle being used by the Police, Fire & Rescue Service Ambulance Services or Special Services on response to an incident;
“parking attendant”	means any person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any waiting and or loading restrictions;
“road marking”	means a traffic sign consisting of a line or legend on a road.

Please note;

- (a) All words importing the singular also include the plural and vice versa where the context requires.
- (b) Except where the context otherwise requires, references to any enactment include any such enactment as amended, extended or applied by or under any other enactment.
- (c) All signs, road markings etc., shall comply with “The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016”.

3. No waiting and no loading at any time

- (a) Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable or parking attendant in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in any of the lengths of roads specified and coloured red in the Schedule to this Order.

4. Exceptions to restrictions in Article 3

- (i) Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of the roads referred to in those Articles:
 - (a) for so long as may be necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage;
 - (b) or so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of the roads so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of the roads, of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus;
 - (c) for so long as it may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing to be used as an emergency service vehicle for the Fire and Rescue Service, Ambulance or Police purposes;
 - (d) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his control or if such waiting is necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (ii) No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable or parking attendant in uniform.
