South Ayrshire Council (The Battery (pier access road) Ayr) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting (Part Time) Order 2024

South Ayrshire Council in exercise of the powers conferred on it under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, the Road Traffic (Permitted Parking Area and Special Parking Area) (South Ayrshire Council) Designation Order 2012 and the Road Traffic Act 1991 and of all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:-

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as "South Ayrshire Council (The Battery (pier access road) Ayr) (Temporary Prohibition of Waiting (Part Time)) Order 2024 and shall come into force at 00:01 hours on Monday 1 April 2024 and will remain in force until 23:59 hours on Tuesday 30 September 2024.

<u>Interpretation</u>

2. In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them—

"Schedule" means the Schedule(s) annexed as relative hereto;

"vehicle" unless the context otherwise requires, means a vehicle of any description and

includes a machine or implement of any kind drawn or propelled along roads whether

or not by mechanical power.

"universal service provider" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000;

"universal postal service" has the same meaning as in the Postal Services Act 2000:

- 3. A reference in this Order to any enactment is a reference to that enactment as amended by any subsequent enactment.
- 4. A reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.

Temporary Waiting Restriction

- 5. Save as provided in Articles 6 and 7, no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a parking attendant in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of roads on the days and during the times specified in the Schedule to this Order.
- 6. Nothing in Article 5 shall prevent any person from causing or permitting a vehicle to wait in any of the lengths of roads referred to in that Article—
 - (i) for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle:
 - (ii) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of any of the lengths of roads so referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to any of the said lengths of roads, of any sewer or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any electronic communications apparatus;

- (iii) to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used to access premises, or in pursuance of statutory powers and duties and in particular, but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with police, fire & rescue and ambulance purposes;
- (iv) if the vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid injury or damage to persons or property;
- (v) if the vehicle bearing the livery of a provider of a universal postal service which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is stationary only for so long as may be reasonably necessary for postal packets to be collected or delivered to or from adjacent premises or posting boxes;
- (vi) for the purpose of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is standing at the kerb and is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwelling house to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;
- (vii) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with wedding or funeral operations.
- (viii) if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by East Ayrshire Council, or an appointed contractor and is waiting in any of the lengths of roads so referred for a provision of service, or whilst being used in connection with the implementation and maintenance of the traffic management signs pertaining to this Order;

7. Notwithstanding anything in Article 5, the driver of a vehicle waiting shall move the said vehicle on the instruction of a police officer in uniform or parking attendant in uniform whenever such moving may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of preventing an obstruction or danger to others.
